Research Interests and Ongoing Research

My research centres on the archaeology of Egypt, Sudan, and the Ancient Near East. Specific interests include administrative systems and manufacturing industries in these regions, burial customs over time, and the development of ancient architectural landscapes. I examine the motifs and appearance of artifacts from a holistic perspective, and incorporate results from scientific analyses in my research. The geographic origin of the material employed to make an artifact, use-wear, and find locations are also considered in my work.

Outside of my scholarly field, I am also interested in languages, both modern and ancient, and historical writings. I also maintain a keen interest in visual culture, customs and literature of different lands and social groups as well as music.

I aspire to hold a full-time academic job, lead my own excavation team in Egypt, and contribute to the spread of public knowledge about ancient world civilizations.
