Poster Session Expectations

For the poster session, you should convert your artifact analysis project into a poster format. The poster should be 2' X 3' and mounted on a foam core board. I recommend putting together your poster before writing your other final documents--it will help you organize your ideas and prepare to write!

Poster Sessions...

are a common way for scholars to share their work with each other at professional conferences. A good poster should have a clear focus, be visually organized and engaging, cover the main points of the research project, be well-grounded in sources, and thank any supporters. During poster sessions, presenters usually stand by their posters and discuss the content with their audience members.

Your poster should include the following:

- A descriptive title and subtitles
- Your name and email address
- An official school logo. The class and project name
- An overview of your project
- A summary of your specific historical inquiry
- A summary of your broad historical inquiry
- A summary of your linguistic inquiry
- In-text citations for all information from sources, whether you directly quote, paraphrase, or summarize the source (APA or MLA)
- A references list
- Acknowledgements
- At least one image with a source for the image

At the poster session, you should be ready to provide your audience with a one-minute overview of your project. After that, you will spend about 15 minutes in conversation with your audience about the project. Your audience will include other ENGL A476 students and interested members of the UAA community.
