INTRODUCTION

The SIMUC was created in 2015 in Vienna, Austria, in response to the need for an institution that could function as a network for the coordination and promotion of the efforts of Chilean musicians and musicologists at an international level. Our main objective is to disseminate Chilean classical music and to give visibility in the world to the work of those who work in this field.

For these purposes, we have worked since our inception in different lines of action, such as the organization of concerts, the publication of columns, podcasts, among others. One of these areas has been the compilation and publication of relevant information about Chilean music and musicians in our database, something that has allowed us to connect with the Chilean music community and has given us visibility, allowing us to reach more people in different parts of the world.

The following pages present a summary of the information published in the database and a review of the data available through September 22, 2022.

Following seven years of work, during which numerous advances and improvements have been made, we now have sufficient data to take a panoramic view and an initial assessment of the information currently available. In doing so, we are making this database more accessible so that valuable information can be obtained from it. In addition, this allows us to expand the scope it has had so far, to allow the information to continue to grow much more, and to continue the project in the long term.

ABOUT THE DATA BASE

In pursuit of the goal of promoting Chilean classical music internationally, the Database is a long-standing project that started around the same time as the creation of the SIMUC. This initiative arose from the necessity of organizing a vast amount of scattered data about Chilean classical music and musicians active worldwide. The data is categorized into thematic sections, which are regularly reviewed and made accessible on the SIMUC website.

Moreover, we continually gather new information and receive feedback from the community through dedicated online forms for each section. The SIMUC Executive Team is responsible for managing the data and maintaining the lists. The significance of this initiative lies in its ability to consolidate essential information relevant to the musical community into a single, reliable source.

The database offers structured information of great use in the field of music performance, musicology, journalism and cultural management.

In addition, the database users primarily come from the music scene. The database serves as a user-friendly platform for efficiently sharing information in real-time.

Currently, the database comprises five published sections. The most recent section, titled "Institutions of the Chilean Academic Music Scene," is not included in the present review as it is still in the initial phase of data collection. The data in this section, which covers several institutions, is not yet fully representative of their purpose. Therefore, only a brief description will be provided for now.

DESCRIPTION

Chilean Musicians Abroad

This is a list of names of Chilean individuals who reside outside the country and are involved in the field of classical music in various areas such as musical performance, choral and orchestral conducting, composition, musicology, etc. This is a dynamic registry that requires constant review and updating. It was published in 2016 and initially contained 60 names.

This section provides highly valuable information for generating networks of contacts among different individuals in the musical domain, thus facilitating connections between the artistic world and related entities. Moreover, the available data could be of great value when developing artistic projects and considering international cultural policies.

Catalog of Chilean Compositions

This is a comprehensive digital catalog featuring works by national composers from all eras. The project is a large-scale undertaking that began with funding from the Music Fund in 2017, led by the cellist and vice-president of SIMUC, Daygoro Serón, with contributions from musicologist Cristian Spencer. During its initial stage, the project focused on developing the database, establishing criteria, and selecting the first set of works.

In 2020, a second phase of the project, with guidance from musicologist Luis Merino, expanded and enhanced the database system. This involved refining data entry, storage, and display methods, resulting in a single interconnected and complementary system. An intranet access was also implemented for the work team, along with additional tools aimed at enhancing the user experience.

The catalog now boasts more than 800 works by Chilean composers, providing a gateway for performers worldwide to explore Chilean music repertoire, which often remains unfamiliar to many.

It is an important record that allows the SIMUC to account for both the impact and scope of its activities and the active presence of many composers in activities at the international level.



CHILEAN MUSICIANS ABROAD

This list, consisting of over 600 names, can be accessed through interactive navigation on a map. The map enables easy visualization of the locations of these names in various cities.

This makes it convenient to distinguish where there is a greater concentration of Chilean musicians. At the same time, it is possible to zoom in to see the detail of people per city.



Based on the available data, and as evident from the interactive map below, the largest concentration of Chilean musicians is found in the USA and Central Europe.

Chilean musicians have a presence in 39 countries, with a maximum number of 190 individuals in Germany.


Next, we present a review of the ten countries with the highest number of Chilean musicians. Additionally, we explore the musical specialties represented in this list.

Afterward, we take a closer look at the presence of Chilean musicians in Germany, which has the largest concentration of them.


We highlight the cities with the most significant representation and discuss the various musical specialties they are involved in.

Music Professions*














